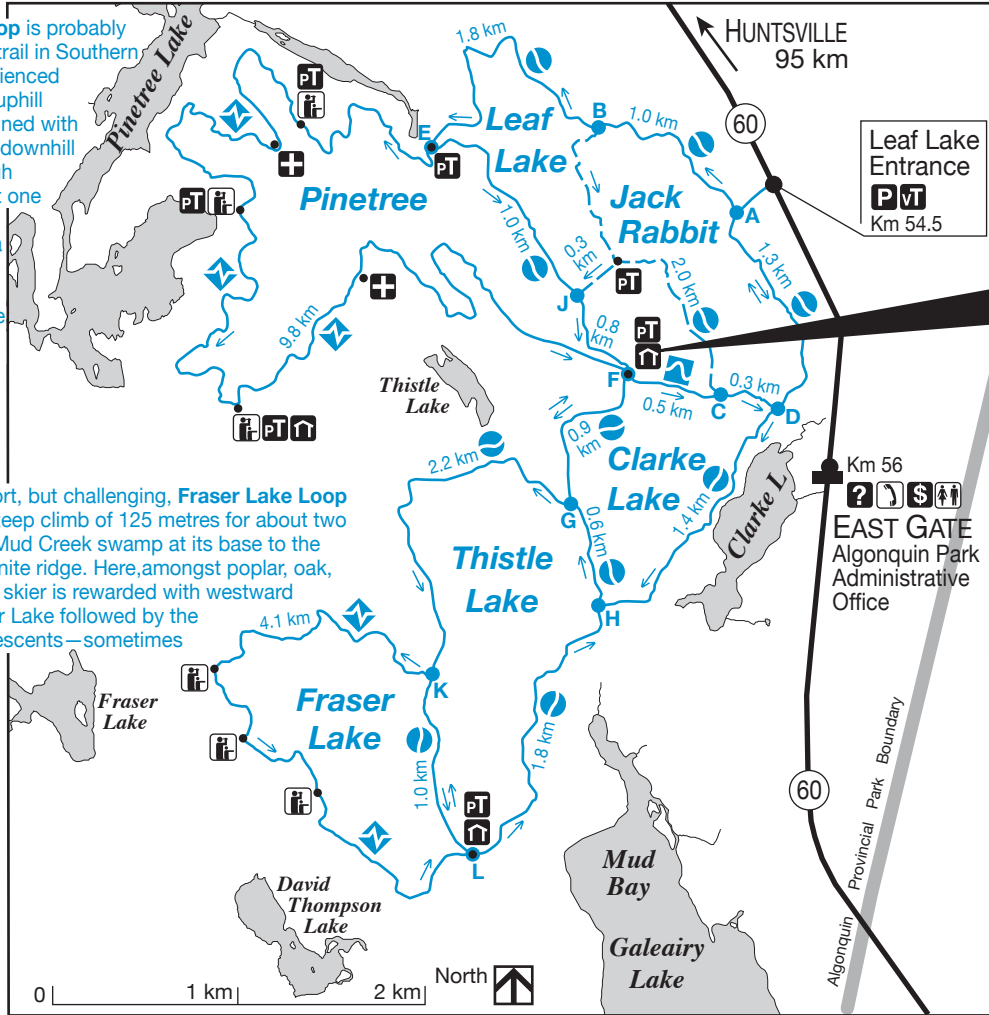


Leaf Lake Ski Trail

The **Pinetree Loop** is probably the premiere ski trail in Southern Ontario for experienced skiers. Vigorous uphill climbs are combined with long exhilarating downhill runs. Built through rugged terrain, at one point the trail passes through a narrow gap in a scenic rock wall. On clear days the scenic lookouts provide vistas of more than 15 kilometres.

The relatively short, but challenging, **Fraser Lake Loop** takes you on a steep climb of 125 metres for about two kilometres from Mud Creek swamp at its base to the top of a level granite ridge. Here, amongst poplar, oak, and conifers, the skier is rewarded with westward views over Fraser Lake followed by the compensating descents—sometimes steep, long and thrilling—to Thistle Cabin.



"Dee's Cabin"
 This cabin is dedicated to the memory of Dee Dunsford. Dee, an Algonquin Park Warden and Interior Group Leader, died tragically in an accident on Clarke Lake in January 2001. Dee, who spent her entire career of fifteen years employed by the Ministry of Natural Resources, was a person who was passionate about the Park. She was an avid outdoorswoman and her resource management professionalism was reflective of her respect and admiration of the natural and cultural values that Algonquin Park symbolizes to many Canadians. Dee was a very strong supporter of the Algonquin Park Ski Marathon/Loppet, an event that started and finished at Clarke Lake. It is appropriate then that the financial contributions from the Loppet paid for the construction of this cabin. The Loppet Committee gratefully acknowledges Dee's contributions to the Ski Loppet and her service in Algonquin Park.
