
The 2012 Algonquin Park Trout Fishing Survey - Final Results.

We would like to thank of all our contributors to this year's backcountry Park lakes trout fishing survey for their continued support of, and enthusiasm for, this important project. It is the only one of its kind; an initiative to measure effort, catch, and harvest of wild trout stocks in one of their last remaining strongholds. Of the 274 surveys that were distributed to angling parties that camped on backcountry Park lakes, 91 were returned. Ten other groups responded either in person or by email. The fine quality information and the remarkably high return rate bears testament to the interest and concern of our participants.

We received reports from 51 lakes and 3 rivers, and Tables 1 and 2 summarize all of the information. From the total of 5077 rod hours (1 angler fishing for 1 hour = 1 rod hour) of effort, 2178 trout were reported caught and only 780 fish were kept. The fact that just 35.8 percent of all fish caught were killed is the single best indicator of the high quality of trout angling in the backcountry of Algonquin Park. The primary attraction for anglers is not to kill a lot of trout, but simply to enjoy the catching of them with good friends and family. The Park still harbours healthy wild trout populations, and we shall continue to monitor these irreplaceable fisheries.
